AB <u>REPORT No.2 THE TRANSPORT HUB</u> ROAD SAFETY and ACCIDENT COST CONSIDERATIONS

Department for Transport ROAD CASUALTIES in GB. (Year 2008)

- 1.0 Personal Injury road traffic accidents reported in Great Britain;
- 1.1 There were **170,591** road injury accident reported by the Police of these **25,462** involved death or serious injury.
- 1.2 There were **16,297** injury accidents to pedal cyclists, of these **2,565** involved death or serious injury.
- 2.0 **In Greater London** the TRL. Study indicated that in the year reviewed the Police reported **44,500** casualties. However the Hospitals reported that they treated many more and the TRL reports that the figure should be in the region of **68,500** injured on London's roads. The suggested reason being that some of those injured do not report their accident to the Police.

Approximately **30** % of all accidents involved Two Wheeled Vehicles.

- 3.0 **In Surrey** the Police reported **5,939** injury accidents in 2008, of these **528** involved death or serious injury.
- 4.0 In considering:-
 - 4.1 The predicted long term rise in fuel and transport costs.
 - 4.2 The need to promote a **safe** low carbon emission means of transport.
- 4.3 The proposed housing expansion scheme with its priority for three bedroom units within this and adjacent Districts.
 - 4.4 The proposed development related population increase.
 - 4.5 The need to provide factory, office, school, and other community services.
 - 4.6 The need to provide adequate and **safe** access to the **HUB**.

It is suggested and Recommended that:-

A **safe** network of cycle / pedestrian routes be considered, planned and progressively established in advance of the proposed housing, office, school, and community related developments.
